NIM'S FRUIT CRISPS

Manufacturing healthy snacks from a state-of-the-art British factory in the heart of Kent

Nim's Fruit Crisps set up a production facility in Sittingbourne, Kent, and chose the area because of its access to Kent fruit farmers and the transport links to London and Europe. Nimisha uses local products as much as possible and values being able to visit Kent farms to look at produce to ensure it is as fresh as possible.

The company's aim is to become the leading healthy snack manufacturer in the UK for both the domestic and export market.

MACKNADE FINE FOODS

Macknade Fine Foods, a familyrun business, has been rooted in Faversham, Kent for over 170 years. What began as a family farm in 1847 has evolved into a 10,000 sqft food & drink retail space and café. The current food hall was introduced over 40 years ago and has thrived ever since.

Stefano Cuomo, the sixth generation Managing Director, continues the legacy started by his great-greatgreat-grandfather Fredrick Neame Sr. Macknade Farm was once a leading regional grower, famous for its fruit, hops, and livestock.

Notably, pears from their orchards were served at Princess Elizabeth's wedding in 1947.

Today, the site features a food hall offering local craft beers, exotic fruits, a florist, fishmongers, butchers, a café, and an outdoor Deck area for live music and alfresco dining in warmer months.

Macknade's growth is driven by its proximity to a significant population and the London market, attracting those seeking a better work/life balance. The unique experience they offer keeps both tourists and regular customers coming back.

GROWUP FARMS

GrowUp Farms, based in Kent, is showing the way for the UK's vertical farming industry. This innovative B-Corp business harnesses advanced hydroponic systems and LED lighting to cultivate leafy greens and herbs indoors, achieving year-round production without pesticides. By optimising space and resource efficiency, Grow Up Farms has significantly reduced water usage and carbon footprint compared to



traditional farming. Their produce, known for its freshness and quality, is supplied to local supermarkets and restaurants, illustrating a scalable and sustainable model that addresses food security and environmental concerns. With more than £100 million invested in the county and a growing customer base, Grow Up Farm's success highlights how vertical farming is revolutionising horticulture as we know it.

CHAPEL DOWN WINES

Fifteen years ago, Chapel Down Wines set out to transform the public's perception of English wine. Today, they are achieving global recognition and part of a UK wine industry worth over £10bn in 2022.

Ten years ago the Tenterden-based producer raised £4.35 million through an equity issue, boosting wine and beer production, upgrading systems, and enhancing marketing efforts. The next year, Chapel Down became the first UK company to use crowdfunding, securing over €5 million. This funding

THANET EARTH

Thanet Earth, located in Kent, is a market leader in sustainable agriculture and high-tech horticulture. Launched in 2008, this vast greenhouse complex is the largest of its kind in the UK, covering over 90 hectares. Thanet Earth employs cutting-edge hydroponic systems and advanced climate control technologies to produce a variety of crops, including tomatoes, cucumbers, and peppers, all year round. This innovative approach significantly reduces the need for pesticides and optimises water use, aligning with environmentally friendly




